What is PAUMCS?

PAUMCS was organized April 14, 1982 in Dallas, Texas. Since then, meetings have been held annually, quarterly newsletters published, by-laws and logo adopted, working committees appointed, chapters organized and Certification Institute established.

At the **1988 General Conference**, legislation was adopted that states the General Council on Finance and Administration (GCFA) has the authority and responsibility, "To provide guidance and consultation of continuing education of church secretaries, including establishment of training and certification programs, and to provide assistance to the **Professional Association of United Methodist Church Secretaries.** The name change and a new logo were approved at the 2017 PAUMCS annual conference in Chicago, IL.

The Western NC Chapter of PAUMCS was established October 5, 1991, with the election of officers, adoption of by-laws and establishment of a quarterly newsletter. In the last 25 years, a regular Annual Meeting and a Spring Fellowship Day have been held. The chapter has hosted 2 National Conferences (2004, 2014).

The Mission of PAUMCS is to provide a supportive base for the unity and fellowship of its members, individual growth, professional development, continuing education and spiritual enrichment.

On-line Certification Classes are held annually through GCFA. Recertification is required and provided at the WNC Annual Meetings and National Meetings


