





2020 Lay Servant Course Descriptions

The Basic Course acquaints you with your gifts, calling, and responsibilities as a follower of Christ. It offers guidelines for best practices as a church leader and in mission and ministry in the community and in daily life. This course is the foundational course for lay speaker training and is a pre-requisite for any Advanced Course.
